GRANT FUNDING TO MAKE A SPLASH



Warren Shire Council has been successful in obtaining \$856,903 in funding from the Stronger Country Communities Fund Round 5 (SCCFR5) for upgrades to amenities, change rooms, kiosk and clubroom facilities at the Warren War Memorial Swimming Pool.

The Hon. Sam Faraway MLC paid a visit to Warren on Sunday 15 January 2023 to meet with Mayor Milton Quigley and community members to celebrate the application's success.

ON THE ROADS

With water receding and a number of roads reopening to traffic across the Shire, crews have been able to make progress on damage repairs and standard maintenance works. Recent works include various flood damage works, shoulder grading, ripping and shaping, patching, spraying and guideposting, signs and slashing.

In addition, upcoming maintenance and rehabilitation works include: **Gradgery Lane, Duffity Lane, Old Warren Road, Ellengerah Road, Wonbobbie Lane, Cullenburrawang Road, Gibson Way and Carinda Road.**
