The gateway to the Macquarie Marshes recently received a major upgrade, with the Burrima Boardwalk Access Road seal now officially complete. These works will have widespread benefits for our Shire, providing both a comfortable all-access road for residents and improved access to one of the most recognisable tourist attractions in our region.

In further upgrade news, Warren Shire's latest amenities are now open to the public in the Warren CBD and Lions Park, with the accompanying murals also expected for completion in July.

LOCAL ROADS ON THE MEND

The Burrima Boardwalk Access Road seal is officially complete and ready to welcome residents and tourists through the gates to the Macquarie Marshes.

This essential infrastructure upgrade will help to improve accessibility to one of our Shire's most iconic natural assets and visitor attractions, creating further tourism opportunities for our region.

The 2.6km stretch of road was completed as a private project for, and funded by the Macquarie Wetlands Association, providing an improved, smooth and comfortable all-access road.

Discussions are underway with affected Councils and local MPs, with affected stakeholders encouraged to send a letter to the NAB CEO asking for reconsideration of the closure.
