ELECTION OF MAYOR AND DEPUTY MAYOR



In accordance with the Local Government Act 1993, Councillor Milton Quigley, has been re-elected unopposed as Mayor of Warren Shire for the 12-month period from September 2023 – September 2024.

Clr Quigley has been a Councillor with Warren Shire Council since 2004 and Mayor of Warren Shire since 2018.

Councillor Sarah Derrett has also been re-elected unopposed to the position of Deputy Mayor, following her original election to the role in January 2022. Clr Derrett has been a Councillor with Warren Shire Council since 2016.

TEMPORARY LIBRARY RELOCATION

Council's Librarian is looking to establish a temporary library service at the old tourist information centre in Burton Street, Warren, from 9 October 2023, while library renovations are underway. The service will provide a large variety of new items across all collections, as well as providing a click and collect service for older items, similar to what was used throughout COVID-19 restrictions.
